5 Reports

5.1 Executive Officer

Funding applications

- **Tas Community Fund application – Clarence Mountain Bike Park**
An application was submitted with Cycling South sponsoring the Meehan Range Trail Groomers for funding for a mountain bike skills park at the Clarence Mountain Bike Park but the application was unsuccessful. We have been encouraged to resubmit the application and a meeting is being held with TCF on 28 February 2017.
- **Community Infrastructure Fund – Tasman Bridge to Airport cycling route**
An application was submitted for a minor grant to prepare a feasibility study and concept plan for the Tasman Hwy Pathway between Rosny Hill Road and Mornington roundabout including a grade-separated crossing of the roundabout.
- **Tas Community Fund Application – Tolosa Park Criterium Circuit**
Funds of \$54,000 have been paid into the Cycling South bank account. This will be transferred into a term deposit until the project is complete and payment is required by Glenorchy City Council.

Current Projects

Hobart Bike Map – We are running low in stock of the 2012 version and the EO is starting to work on the new version. Requested funding in the 2017/18 budget to contribute to the cost of design.

Hobart Transport Strategy – Mary met with Inspiring Place on 20 February as part of the consultation with cycling organisations to provide input into the strategy.

5.2 Glenorchy

- **Cycleway road crossings** – plans to put Keep Clear markings so cars don't block cycleway
- **Elwick Rd refuge island** will be installed shortly.
- **Tolosa Park criterium circuit** – design is complete
- **Cycleway signage and chicane gate replacement** – work will commence in March.
- **Main Road bike lanes to Granton** – a report has been prepared for Council to undertake public consultation.

5.3 Clarence

- **Tasman Hwy Path** – Signage has been installed between the Tasman Bridge and Kangaroo Bay Rivulet Track.
- **Clarence Mountain Bike Park** – A map board sign has been designed and awaiting approval from PWS. Two groups of disadvantaged youth from Bridgewater and Huonville have commenced work on the Friends Track as part of Project Booyah.
- **Kangaroo Bay Development** – The requirement for a walking/cycling connection from Clarence St to the Foreshore Trail is likely to be removed from the condition in the approved DA for the Crown Land site.
- **Clarence Foreshore Trail** – A risk assessment is being carried out to identify problem areas and develop guidelines. The ramp at Simmons Park has been constructed to DDA requirements.
- **Clarence Foreshore Trail from Simmons Park to Anzac Park** – A consultant is working on a design.
- **Howrah Road & Tramere Rd** – A report has been done for on-road bike lanes
- **Clarence St safety improvements** – Consultation will be done in March using 3D images.
- **Cambridge Road, Mornington** – A tender is out for road widening, kerb and gutter and on-road bike lanes

5.3 Hobart

- **Hobart Transport Strategy** – Underway with private transport (including cycling) open for consultation. The strategy will be developed over the next year.
- **Morrison St** – The widened pathways around the waterfront are complete.
- **Sandy Bay Road** –. Bike lanes are complete.
- **Federal St and Commercial Rd** – the design for the bike entry point at Commercial Rd and bike lanes on Federal St have been done.
- **Lenah Valley Shopping Precinct** – Consultation is underway and includes uphill bike lanes.

5.4 Kingborough

- **Wetlands Track** – The track from Cottage Lane through the wetlands area has commenced.
- **Dog policy** – Out for public consultation soon
- **Snug to Margate Trail** – Detailed design is being done.
- **Summerleas Road path** – The footpath has been widened to shared path standard.
- **Tracks and Trails Plan** – Is being reviewed and a draft document will be ready soon. To include Kingborough links – cut throughs and walkways.

5.5 Brighton
