MEMORANDUM: COMMUNITY, CULTURE AND EVENTS COMMITTEE

Taste of Tasmania - Community Survey

At the 9 January 2019 Community, Culture and Events Committee, it was resolved, inter alia that:

Acknowledging the significance and success of the Taste of Tasmania in 2018-19, its economic benefits to the state, noting the concerns and recommendations in the report of the Associate Director of City Economy, Tourism & Events marked as item 4.1 of the Closed Community, Culture and Events Committee 9 January 2019, and recognising the financial burden placed upon Hobart ratepayers to fund the Taste of Tasmania, before making a final decision the Council seek the following further information:

A statistically valid random survey of the Hobart community (ratepayers and residents) be undertaken with final questions drafted with the company carrying out the survey to ensure no bias.

A further report on the content of the survey be provided for consideration at a special meeting of the Community, Culture and Events Committee to be scheduled for 21 January 2019.

In response to the Committee's decision that a survey of the Hobart community (ratepayers and residents) be undertaken, Myriad Research has been engaged to formulate the survey questions (see attached) as well as to undertake the survey of Hobart ratepayers and residents.

Mr Brian Correy, Executive Director at Myriad Research will be in attendance at the special Community, Culture and Events Committee meeting being held on 21 January 2019 to answer any questions elected members may have.

RECOMMENDATION

That:

1. The attached draft Taste of Tasmania community survey as prepared by Myriad Research be endorsed by the Council for distribution to Hobart ratepayers and residents.

HCC Survey - Taste of Tasmania

The City of Hobart has been delivering and funding the Taste for the past 30 years. The Taste started as a showcase event for the visitors that the Sydney Hobart race brought to Hobart and over the years it has held a prominent place in the Hobart summer event calendar.

As part of its due diligence in considering the future of this event, Council is seeking the opinion of the Hobart community and would like to hear your views on some key aspects.

By way of context, the most recent Taste included a wide range of Tasmanian food and beverage stallholders, a ticketed New Year's Eve event, fireworks, entertainment and a program of ticketed food events over the seven days.

The City of Hobart contributed \$1.6 million to the running of the 2018-19 event, the State Government provided support to a value of approximately \$100,000 with other funding coming from sponsorship, ticketed events and stallholder fees.
