City of Hobart Lord Mayor Annual Report

November 2022–November 2023

I'm pleased to present my annual report for the year between November 2022 and November 2023.

- The Lord Mayor's Office has received and responded to 893 items of correspondence.
- I've had 81 one-on-one constituent meetings, including at 18 Mayor in the Chair sessions held in places around the City.
- Held 138 additional meetings with organisations, businesses and government agencies and politicians.
- I've also launched or opened 124 events, hosted 8 receptions, 9 Town Hall sessions for schools and provided 53 media interviews.

All of this activity is central to undertaking the specific duties of a mayor set by the *Local Government Act 1993*. These include:

- to act as a **leader of the community** of the municipal area;
- to **carry out the civic and ceremonial functions** of the mayoral office;
- to **promote good governance** by, and within, the Council;
- to act as **chairperson of the Council** and to chair meetings of the Council in a manner that supports decision-making processes;
- to act as the **spokesperson for the Council**;
- to **represent the Council** on regional organisations and at intergovernmental forums at regional, state and federal levels;
- to **lead** and participate in the **appointment**, and the monitoring of the performance, **of the general manager**; and
- To liaise with the general manager on:
 - – the activities of the Council and the performance and exercise of its functions and power; and
 - – the activities of the general manager and the performance and exercise of powers in supporting the Council.



I am thankful for the small dedicated team that supports the Lord Mayor in carrying out this legislated role and functions.

I hope this report is of interest to everyone interested in the City of Hobart.

**Constituent correspondence and meetings**

The Office of the Lord Mayor has directly received and responded to 893 pieces of correspondence on a variety of matters via email and letter. Some of these queries and issues were able to be dealt with by research, discussions with City staff or referrals to more appropriate agencies.

As a result of more complex issues raised in this correspondence, Lord Mayor Reynolds met with 81 residents, both in the office and at on-site visits.

Mayor in the Chair

Lord Mayor Reynolds also met with residents via regular 'Mayor in the Chair' listening sessions. These provide an opportunity for community members to raise issues or ask questions without making an appointment. They take place in the Henry Hunter Room at the Hobart Town Hall and in suburban cafés around Hobart.

In the last year, 18 Mayor in the Chair sessions were held, including 11 in the suburbs of West Hobart, Glebe, South Hobart, Lenah Valley, New Town, Battery Point, North Hobart, Mt Nelson, Hobart, Fern Tree and Sandy Bay.

Community events, launches and official openings

Lord Mayor Reynolds attended, launched or opened 124 events.

Citizenship ceremonies

The City of Hobart holds citizenship ceremonies on behalf of the Australian Government and Lord Mayor Reynolds presides over the ceremonies.

Over the last year, the City of Hobart conducted six ceremonies where 360 candidates became Australian citizens.

School Tours

Lord Mayor Reynolds hosts Town Hall tours for school groups to assist students to understand the history of the city and the role of Local Government in Australian democracy.

The tour includes time in the Council Chamber where local decisions are made that impact on Hobart citizens. Students participate in a ‘mock’ Council meeting and learn about Australia’s third level of government.

During the year, nine groups from Fahan School, Lenah Valley Primary School, Princes Street Primary School and the Hutchins School took up the opportunity to learn about the role of local government and its operations.

Children's Mayor Program

In 2023, we 'elected' the City's third Children's Mayor and Deputy Mayor.

The program, as part of National Children's Week, saw Hobart primary school students encouraged to participate in local government, and experience life in Town Hall for themselves.

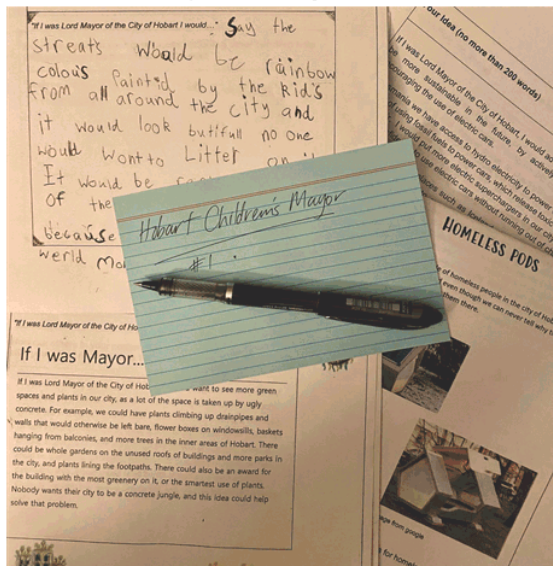
Students from schools across the city were invited to write their own manifestos as to what they would do if given the role of Lord Mayor of Hobart.

Lord Mayor Reynolds hosted a Children's Morning Tea where the winning manifestos were read at a formal reception in Hobart Town Hall.

Olive Nielsen from Princes Street Primary School was declared the 2023 Children's Mayor for her idea *Let's power Hobart sustainably!* Encouraging the installation of a sustainable tram in Hobart.

St Mary's College's Bella Child earned the role of Deputy Children's Mayor with her idea to encourage the children of Hobart to put down their devices for a day and experience a device-free fun day in beautiful Hobart.

14 manifestos were received from students attending the participating schools who select the top 2 from a larger number submitted by students. Both public and private schools within the Hobart local government area participate actively in this program.

3. Promoting good governance

‘to promote good governance by, and within, the Council’

Early in 2023, Lord Mayor Reynolds participated in the development of Elected Members Commitments.

The purpose of the Commitments is to capture an intention and commitment from Elected Members to work respectfully and cooperatively. It is intended to be used as a guide and a tool to challenge behaviour that is inconsistent and to celebrate the emergence of a collaborative and constructive culture.

Lord Mayor Reynolds liaised with the CEO on learning and development sessions for Elected Members including:

- A comprehensive, five-day Elected Member induction program
- A two-day Elected Member Strategic Priority Setting Retreat
- A two-day Annual Elected Member Retreat
- “Rules of Engagement” to provide an opportunity to reset working relationships and agree on a road map for working together as a team for the term of council
- Councillor Behaviour and Conduct, a session by Mat Healy, Director Local Government
- *Anti-Discrimination Act 1998*, an overview by Sarah Bolt, Anti-Discrimination Commissioner
- Cyber Safety, a session with Tasmania Police
- Inclusion and Gender Diversity facilitated by Working it Out.

Lord Mayor Reynolds chaired 16 out of 17 Council Meetings between November 2022 and November 2023.

This includes the swearing in ceremony and two special council meetings.

Lord Mayor Reynolds attended 53 media events or interviews during the year including regular appearances on ABC Breakfast after Council meetings.

Appoint the General Manager

6. Represent the Council

'to lead and participate on the appointment, and the monitoring of the performance, of the general manager'

The Lord Mayor led the recruitment process to appoint a new Council Chief Executive Officer, following former Chief Executive Officer Kelly Grigsby stepping down from her role in July 2023.

A specialist executive recruitment firm was overseen by a Committee of Elected Members comprising the Lord Mayor; Deputy Lord Mayor, Cr Burnet; Ald Behrakis; Cr Dutta and Ald Bloomfield. The process involved a national search, an extensive advertising and marketing strategy, rigorous candidate screening, short-listing, undertaking first interviews and running second interviews with the Full Council to agree on an appointment.

The Council resolved to appoint former Launceston City Council General Manager, Michael Stretton to the role of City of Hobart CEO in October 2023. Mr Stretton will commence with the City of Hobart in February 2024.

The CEO is pivotal to the success of council and the community they serve so this appointment took many hours of the Lord Mayor's time this year. It was important for the Council to ensure a proactive, inclusive and transparent process to make sure the best possible candidate was secured for the role.

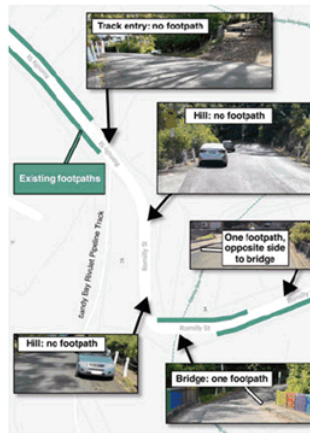

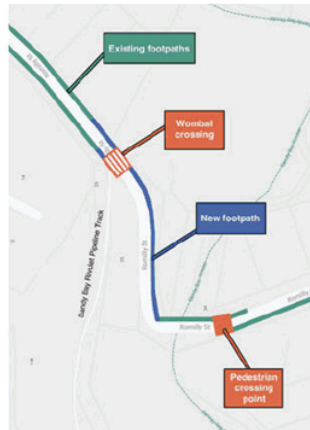
Why this petition matters
